
SIR EDWARD HENRY FOWLER, JR.

was a resident of Belle Vernon, Pennsylvania, but most recently resided in the Masonic Home of Sewickley. He was born on June 28, 1932, raised in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and graduated in 1951 from West View High School. Continuing his education, he studied Accounting and Business Law at Robert Morris Business School from which he graduated in 1953.

Brother Fowler served in the United States Navy. He was employed for almost forty years by the Aluminum Company of America. He retired as Manager Property Sales and Excise Tax. Professionally, he was an Associate Member of the Tax Executives Institute and Past President of the Institute of Professionals in Taxation. Brother Fowler was a Lutheran by faith. He was devoted to his wife of many years; Lois Jean Fowler, who preceded him in death.

Brother Fowler's interest in Masonry dates to 1953 when he was raised in Avalon Lodge No. 657. He served as Right Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania in 1992-1993. He participated in the York Rite Bodies serving as Most Excellent High Priest in 1970, Thrice Illustrious Master in 1973 and Eminent Commander in 1969. He was active in the Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, NMJ receiving the Thirty Third Degree in 1974. He was a member of Syria Temple. In addition, he participated in and led many other appendant bodies of Freemasonry.

Brother Fowler passed away on Friday, September 28, 2018. To his loved ones and all others who held him dear, we extend the condolences of the Provincial Grand Lodge. Brother Fowler's dedication to Masonry earned him the respect and affection of the Craft. His devotion to duty served as a model to inspire us all.
